Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

Every campus will improve student performance on the STAAR/EOC assessment in each of the accountability groups as measured by:

- a. Increasing the number of students passing all tests until 90% are accomplishing this measure.**
- b. Reducing the number of students failing more than one test and to increase student progress to one year of growth or more.**

School Goals

We strive to have all students on or above grade level in reading/writing and math.

By 2018, 90% of students will be successful on all assessments in all areas they are assessed by STAAR.

All students who continue to make gains in all assessed areas.

Our focus in reading will be:

- Sight words and Word Wall words for PreK-2nd grade.
- School wide system for summarizing stories, finding the main idea, and elements of a story.
- exposure to a variety of text genres
- School wide system for developing authentic writing in all learners

Our focus in math will be:

- vocabulary development
- numeracy/number sense
- To create a problem solving mindset for all learners.

Teachers, Parents, Students – Together for Success

At School

Lee Elementary will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families are listed below.

- Weekly folders will be sent home to inform parents of student learning, activities and behavior.
- Contact parents when students are struggling in classes.
- Goals will be developed with students that focus on increasing their skills in reading/writing, math, and science. Assessment data will be used to develop these goals.
- Provide parent information nights regarding the STAAR and balanced literacy.
- Provide quality instruction and assessments using the TEKS and Curriculum provided by AISD.
- School wide system for summarizing stories, finding the main idea, and elements of a story.
- School wide system for developing authentic writing in all learners.

At Home

Lee parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. They are listed below.

- Use weekly folders to discuss my child's learning, activities and behavior.
- Attend the Open House and participate in the reading and math activities offered.
- In reading and math, review assessment information and goals with the student to monitor and encourage progress.
- Attend parent sessions to see and practice new ways to support reading and math.
- Read with my child every day and ask questions about the text.
- Attend Family Science Night at the Discovery Center

Students

Lee students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they cannot only succeed, but excel in reading and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Give parents notes and papers to sign when they are sent home with me.
- Tell my parents about my day.
- Go to school on time every day.
- Read every night to a family member.
- Practice my spelling words, word wall words and math daily.
- Go to school with a positive attitude.
